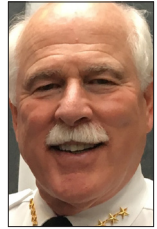


PRISONER RELEASE ALERT SYSTEM



UPDATED APRIL 16 FROM SHERIFF THOMAS HODGSON: WHAT IS THE PRISONER RELEASE ALERT SYSTEM?

My main charge as Sheriff of Bristol County is public safety. It's the No. 1 priority for all in law enforcement. I took an oath to protect the people of Bristol County and beyond and do everything I can to make our great county a safer place to live, work and raise a family.



There have been plenty of headlines lately about illegal immigrants being released from the Bristol County

ICE detention center because of the COVID-19 epidemic. While no inmates or detainees in our correctional facilities have tested positive for COVID-19, the justice system has decided that some illegal aliens must be released to protect them from COVID-19.

That's why today, the Bristol County Sheriff's Office is launching the Prisoner Release Alert System to help protect the people of Bristol County from potential victimization. The law-abiding people of Bristol County and beyond have a right to know who is being released back into their communities. As of today, more than 30 illegal immigrants in ICE custody have been released from our correctional facilities, some of whom have been charged or convicted of crimes such as rape, robbery, assault, fraud, trafficking fentanyl and others. Some of them also had final removal orders from an immigration judge to be deported to their country of origin, but are instead free to roam the neighborhoods of our communities.

Starting today, we're going to share the criminal history of the people the justice system has ordered be released from custody due to COVID-19, and we'll update the list every time new releases are ordered and processed. We can't give the names due to CORI laws, but we can share the charges and/or convictions, if there are any.

And again, we're doing this for your safety. Simply put, you have the right to know who may be walking around your neighborhoods because of these court decisions. Be safe everyone.

APRIL 16 UPDATE

While the federal court continues to pursue the release of ICE detainees, the state's top court has ruled that jails and prisons across the state must reduce their population to protect them from COVID-19.

In Bristol County, that means 30 individuals facing a variety of criminal charges have had their bail amounts lowered or, in many cases, reduced to zero and are now free to roam around our neighborhoods and communities in an effort to protect them from COVID-19.

I believe the people of Bristol County have a right to know the backgrounds of these people who are no longer behind bars because of this court ruling. So we've updated our Prisoner Release Alert System to include the charges faced by county inmates who were recently released because of the court decision. All of these crimes were committed in Bristol County.

We'll continue to update the Alert System when, if any, more county inmates or ICE detainees are ordered released due to COVID-19. It's also worth noting that no inmate or detainee in a Bristol County correctional facility has tested positive for COVID-19.
